1. **Preamble**

SAFIRE (Southern Alliance for Indigenous Resources) is a Zimbabwean non-governmental organisation, registered as a Private Voluntary Organisation and headquartered in Harare, working on natural resource management, sustainable livelihoods and climate resilience with rural communities. SAFIRE is implementing the E.C.O.T.E.R.R.A initiative (Empowerment of Communities and Organisations Transforming Economies towards Restoration of Rural Areas, SAFIRE project code SAF/ECO/05) in Bikita and Chiredzi Districts of Masvingo Province as a partner of CESVI, which has received a grant from the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS) for the implementation of a development cooperation operation, Initiative AID 013244/06/3, and intends to apply a portion of that grant to payments under this contract. AICS will establish the final amount of the grant and will liquidate it on completion of the operation on the basis of the expenses presented and declared eligible. No party other than SAFIRE and CESVI shall derive any rights from the grant or have any claim to its proceeds. Under no circumstances or for no reason whatsoever will the donor entertain any request for indemnity or payment directly submitted by SAFIRE contractors.

The operation foresees the conservation and regeneration of protected and degraded areas, community fire management, farmer managed natural regeneration (FMNR) and the reclamation of gullies on degraded land in Bikita and Chiredzi Districts. SAFIRE therefore invites sealed tenders for the supply and delivery of the following lots:

- ❑ Lot 1 – Fencing materials for the conservation and regeneration of protected areas: game fencing and 8-strand fencing materials for 27 one-hectare sites in Bikita District and 30 one-hectare sites in Chiredzi District, together with the associated fencing tools and consumables.
- ❑ Lot 2 – Fire control equipment: fire beaters, fire rakes, slashers, knapsack sprayers, personal protective equipment, first aid kits and awareness materials for community fire management committees in Bikita and Chiredzi.
- ❑ Lot 3 – FMNR equipment: pruning and land preparation hand tools for farmer managed natural regeneration activities in Bikita and Chiredzi.
- ❑ Lot 4 – Materials for gully reclamation: gabion mesh, geo-fabric, reinforcement bar, gabion stone, hand tools and protective wear for three gully sites in Bikita District and five gully sites in Chiredzi District.
- ❑ Each lot should include transportation and delivery of all materials to the delivery points specified in Annex A. Tenderers must price transportation and delivery within their lot offer; no separate fee will be paid for transport, handling or offloading. All labour costs for installation will be catered for separately by SAFIRE. Tenderers must not include any installation labour in their prices.

The exact specification and quantity for each item are set out in Annex A (Technical Specifications and Bills of Quantities) of this document. Prices must be entered on the schedules provided in Annex A and summarised on the Bid Form at Annex B.

The Tenderers may apply for a single lot or for more lots and they must offer the whole quantity indicated in every lot they applied for.

Only bids complete with all of the quantities required will be taken into consideration. The tenderer must guarantee that all items offered are manufactured and procured in accordance with the origin rules as above specified.

Quantities indicated in Annex A are subject to a 20% fluctuation margin (increase or decrease) per item throughout the duration of the contract.

2. Timetable

3. Participation

To be eligible for participation in this tender, tenderers must be legally registered in Zimbabwe and must prove that they have a curriculum with relevant prior experience in the supply of fencing, civil works, agricultural or forestry materials, and in projects financed by international donors or non-governmental organisations. Tenderers must also prove to the Contracting Authority that they comply with the necessary legal, technical and financial requirements, as detailed below. Copies of the following must be included in Envelope A:

- Certificate of Incorporation and Certificate of Registration of the company;
- CR6 / CR14 (or equivalent) showing directors and registered office;
- Valid ZIMRA Tax Clearance Certificate (ITF263) covering the tender validity period;
- VAT registration certificate, where the tenderer is a registered operator;
- Valid registration with the Procurement Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe (PRAZ), where applicable;
- Proof of a registered physical business address and trading premises in Zimbabwe;
- A bank statement or bank reference letter proving ownership of a commercial bank account in the name of the company;
- A list of at least three comparable contracts delivered in the past three years, with values, dates and contactable references.
- Remark: Proof of economic and financial capacity may be furnished by one or more of the following documents:
 - Appropriate statements from banks;
 - Statement of overall turnover and turnover concerning the works, supplies or services covered by the contract during a period which may be no more than the last three financial years.
 - If, for some exceptional and justified reason, the tenderer or candidate is unable to provide the references requested, it may prove its economic and financial capacity by any other appropriate means.

Tenderers have to declare, under their responsibility, that they do not fall under ineligibility clauses, that all of the items offered have been manufactured and will be supplied in accordance with international rules against exploitation of child labour and gender discrimination (Annex 5 – Tenderer's Declaration). Participants have also to declare to hold in trust and in confidence any information or documents disclosed in this procedure and to be aware of the SAFIRE and CESVI policies and documents referred to in Annex 5.

Origin of supplies: in accordance with donor procedures and rules applicable to the financing instrument, supplies must originate in an eligible country. Tenderers must declare the origin of the goods offered by means of a signed and stamped Declaration of Origin on the company letterhead, stating the country of origin of each item offered. The country of origin must also be shown against each line of the Annex A schedules. SAFIRE may request supporting evidence (e.g. a manufacturer's or official certificate of origin) before final acceptance of the goods.

4. **Submission of tenders**

4.1 **Required documentation**

Tenders must be submitted in accordance with the double envelope system, i.e. in an outer parcel or envelope containing two separate, sealed envelopes, one bearing the words "Envelope A – Technical offer" and the other "Envelope B – Financial offer".

The envelope A has to include the following documentation:

- Technical specification (Annex A, fully completed and signed);
- Company profile and eligibility documents listed in Section 3;
- Tenderer's declaration (Annex 5), signed and stamped;
- Declaration of Origin on the company letterhead, signed and stamped (see Section 3);

The envelope B has to include the following documentation:

- Financial offer (Annex B – Bid Form, together with the priced schedules of Annex A).

The content of the envelopes is detailed in the following section.

4.2 **ENVELOPE A**

❖ **Technical specifications**

Tenderers must complete, sign and stamp the technical specification schedules in Annex A for every lot they are bidding for, stating for each line the brand or manufacturer offered, the country of origin and full compliance or otherwise with the specification. Materials must meet, as a minimum, the following standards: timber poles H5 CCA-treated for ground contact; barbed and straining wire fully galvanised, 2.0 mm and 2.5 mm as specified; Bonnox game mesh 2.5 mm x 1.8 m x 100 m rolls; welded gabion mesh 2.4 m x 6 m x 200 mm x 200 mm; cement class 32.5N conforming to SAZ standards; and all personal protective equipment certified to a recognised safety standard. Samples may be requested by the evaluation committee.

In respect of supplies: samples, descriptions and/or authentic photographs and/or certificates drawn up by official quality control institutes or agencies of recognised competence attesting the conformity of the products with the specifications or standards in force may be requested.

The standard of the materials offered must be explicitly written in the dedicated columns of the Annex A schedules. Offers that leave the specification columns blank may be declared non-compliant.

❖ **Company profile:**

a) A Company profile (curriculum of activities and history of experience).

One or more of the following documents may furnish proof of technical and professional capacity:

- A list of the principal supplies delivered in the past three years, with the sums, dates and recipients, public or private.
- A description of the measures employed to ensure the quality of supplies.
- An indication of the technicians or technical bodies involved, whether or not belonging directly to the firm, responsible for the maintenance of the equipment.

❖ **Tenderer's declaration** (Annex 5);

❖ **Tender guarantee**

No tender guarantee is required for this procedure. In accordance with the applicable procurement rules, a tender guarantee is optional for open local tenders and the Contracting Authority has elected to waive it. The successful tenderer will instead be required to lodge a performance guarantee as set out in Section 8 below.

4.3 **ENVELOPE B**

❖ **Financial offer:**

- The offer must be drawn up using the Bid Form at Annex B and the priced schedules at Annex A, following SAFIRE guidelines. The bid form may be typed or hand-written in indelible ink. All sections of the form must be completed, signed and stamped.
- Offered prices shall be quoted inclusive of VAT. SAFIRE is not exempt from VAT on this procurement and no VAT exemption documentation will be issued. Tenderers who are registered operators must show the VAT component separately in their financial offer and on all invoices.
- Offered prices must include delivery and transportation of the materials to the delivery points in Bikita and Chiredzi Districts, Masvingo Province, throughout the duration of the contract and according to the time schedules stipulated by SAFIRE. No additional fee will be paid for transportation, handling or offloading.
- Offered prices must be quoted in United States Dollars (USD).
- Delivery time, in calendar days from signature of the contract, must be stated in the dedicated field of the Bid Form for each lot.
- Prices must be valid and fixed until 31 January 2027 (not less than 90 days from the tender deadline). No modification will be accepted from the moment the offer is received.

4.4 **Presentation of bid**

Tender bids, inclusive of all the documents above, must be closed in a sealed outer envelope. The name of the participating company must be written at the top of the outer envelope.

The envelope must bear:

- The words "not to be opened before the tender-opening session" written in English

Any infringement of this requirement (e.g. unsealed envelopes or references to price in the technical offer) will be regarded as a breach of the rules and will lead to rejection of the tender.

The envelopes must be handed to the above address before 15:00 hours (CAT) on Tuesday 20 October 2026. This deadline is to be considered a fixed term and SAFIRE will not accept any justification for delay, even if caused by the postal or courier service.

5. Additional information during the procedure

Tenderers may submit questions in writing to the SAFIRE procurement e-mail address, procurement@safire.co.zw, quoting tender reference SAF/OLT/01, up to 18 days before the deadline for submission of tenders, i.e. by 16:00 hours (CAT) on Friday 2 October 2026. SAFIRE will reply to all tenderers' questions at least 7 days before the deadline for receipt of tenders, i.e. by Friday 9 October 2026. Questions and answers will be circulated to all tenderers who have collected the tender dossier, without disclosing the identity of the questioner.

6. Opening bids procedure

The ceremony of the opening of the envelopes will be held on Friday 23 October 2026 at 10:00 hours (CAT); an ad hoc Tender Evaluation Committee will manage the event. The venue will be the SAFIRE office in Harare.

- The envelopes will be opened and publicly read by the Chair of the above-mentioned Commission.
- After the opening of all the envelopes received within the deadline, the Commission will evaluate their contents behind closed doors.
- The winner will be informed by SAFIRE within 15 days from the opening ceremony.
- All participants in the tender will be informed by e-mail of the results of the tender.

7. Tender evaluation

SAFIRE will evaluate the bids lot by lot. The same evaluation criteria, weightings, formulas and minimum thresholds set out below apply to all four lots (Lots 1 to 4). Each lot is scored and ranked separately: a tenderer bidding for more than one lot receives a separate score for each lot, and price and delivery time are compared only with the other tenders received for that same lot. Tenders will first be checked for administrative compliance and eligibility (Section 3); only compliant tenders will be scored. Scoring is out of 100 points on the following awarding criteria:

- (A) Curriculum of the company, in particular relevant prior experience in supplying comparable materials and in NGO or international agency projects – 20 points;
- (B) Quality of the goods and compliance with the technical specifications detailed in Annex A – 30 points;
- (C) Price of the goods, delivered to the specified districts – 35 points;
- (D) Delivery time to Bikita and Chiredzi Districts, as stated on the Bid Form – 10 points;
- (E) Environmental sustainability of the goods and of the supplier's operations – 5 points.
- Minimum technical threshold: a tender must score at least 39 of the 55 technical points (criteria A + B + E), and at least 21 of the 30 points under criterion B, to be considered further. Price (C) and delivery time (D) points are calculated only among the tenders that pass this threshold for the lot. Where the tender scoring highest on aggregate is not selected, the reasons for the award decision will be recorded in the evaluation report.

Scoring method and formulas (applied identically to Lots 1, 2, 3 and 4)

Step 1 – Administrative compliance (pass/fail). Each tender is checked against the requirements of Sections 3 and 4 (eligibility documents, signed declarations, Declaration of Origin, complete quantities for the lot, correct envelopes). Tenders that fail are not scored.

Step 2 – Technical evaluation (Envelope A, criteria A, B and E, maximum 55 points). Each member of the Tender Evaluation Committee scores each tender individually using the table below. The technical score of a tender is the average of the members' scores. The minimum technical threshold stated above is then applied.

Step 3 – Financial and delivery evaluation (Envelope B, criteria C and D, maximum 45 points). Price and delivery time points are calculated with the formulas below, comparing only the tenders for the same lot that passed Step 2. The lowest-priced tender receives the full 35 price points and the tender with the shortest delivery time receives the full 10 delivery points; all other tenders receive points in proportion.

Step 4 – Total score and ranking. Total score = A + B + C + D + E. All scores are rounded to two decimal places. Tenders are ranked by total score for each lot, and the contract for the lot is normally awarded to the highest-ranked tender. If two tenders have the same total score, the tender with the higher score under criterion B is preferred; if still equal, the tender with the lower price is preferred.

- SAFIRE reserves the right to award each lot separately, and to award more than one lot to the same tenderer where that offers the best value for money.

8. General conditions of the contract agreement

- Payments will be made in United States Dollars (USD) only, by bank transfer to the company bank account of the contractor, after the presentation of a valid fiscal tax invoice approved by the SAFIRE Finance and Administration Manager.
- Payments will be made by SAFIRE from its Harare office by bank transfer, according to the following schedule:
 - 50% (fifty per cent) of the contract price following provisional acceptance of the goods at the delivery points, issued within 10 (ten) days from delivery;
 - 50% (fifty per cent) of the contract price, as payment of the balance outstanding, following final acceptance of the goods, within a maximum of 30 (thirty) days from completion of the entire delivery.
- The successful tenderer will be informed in writing that their tender has been accepted (notification of award). Before the Contracting Authority signs the contract with the successful tenderer, the successful tenderer must provide the documentary proof or statement required under Zimbabwean law to show that it does not fall into the exclusion situations listed in Section 3 of the present dossier.
- If the successful tenderer fails to provide this documentary proof or statement or if the successful tenderer is found to have provided false information, the award will be considered null and void. In such a case, the Contracting Authority may award the tender to another tenderer or cancel the tender procedure.
- If, after the tender has been awarded, a contract agreement with the winner cannot be reached within 7 days of the winner being declared, SAFIRE will be authorised to consult the second ranked bidder, and so on.
- If the winner fails to respect the contract agreement during the implementation of the project, SAFIRE will be authorised to consult the second ranked bidder, and so on.

9. Language of agreement

All correspondence and documents related to the open tender procedure, contracts and reporting shall be written in English.

This English version of this document shall rule between the Parties.

This document has been written in English. In case it will be translated in any other language than English, then the English version shall prevail in case of difference of interpretation.

10. Cancellation of open tender procedure

In the event of the cancellation of a tender procedure, the Contracting Authority will notify tenderers. If the tender procedure is cancelled before the envelope of any tender has been opened, the sealed envelopes will be returned, unopened, to the tenderers.

Cancellation may occur where:

- The tender procedure has been unsuccessful, namely where no qualitatively or financially worthwhile tender has been received or there has been no response at all;
- The economic or technical parameters of the project have been fundamentally altered;
- Exceptional circumstances or force majeure render normal performance of the project impossible;
- All technically compliant tenders exceed the financial resources available;
- There have been irregularities in the procedure, in particular where these have prevented fair competition.

11. Liabilities

In no circumstances will SAFIRE be liable for damages, whatever their nature (in particular damages for loss of profits) or relationship to the cancellation of the open local tender procedure, even if SAFIRE has been advised of the possibility of damages. The publication of a procurement notice does not commit SAFIRE to implement the supply contract announced, and the signature of the contract is bound by the donor financing.

AICS will establish the final amount of the grant and will liquidate it on completion of the operation on the basis of the expenses presented and declared eligible. No party other than SAFIRE and CESVI shall derive any rights from the grant or have any claim to its proceeds. Under no circumstances or for no reason whatsoever will the donor entertain any request for indemnity or payment directly submitted by SAFIRE contractors.

12. Warranty

- The Contractor shall warrant that the supplies are new, unused, of the most recent models and incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials.
- The Contractor shall warrant that none of the supplies have any defects arising from design, material or workmanship.
- This warranty shall remain valid for 12 months after final acceptance of the supplies for fencing materials, gabion mesh and hand tools, and for 6 months for consumable items.

13. Information about the contracting authority

SAFIRE (Southern Alliance for Indigenous Resources) is a Zimbabwean non-governmental organisation working with rural communities on the sustainable management of natural resources, community-based natural resource management, non-timber forest product value chains, climate resilience and land use planning. SAFIRE is implementing the E.C.O.T.E.R.R.A initiative in Bikita and Chiredzi Districts in partnership with CESVI Fondazione Onlus, with funding from the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS) under Initiative AID 013244/06/3. 14. Data protection and privacy

The Parties are informed, and expressly agree, that the personal data provided, even verbally, and all relevant information obtained during the performance of the activities, must be kept strictly confidential and treated appropriately. The Parties undertake to process all data in accordance with the Zimbabwe Data Protection Act [Chapter 11:12] and, where applicable to the donor's requirements, Article 13 of EU Regulation No. 2016/679 (GDPR) as amended, and consent to the processing of personal data for the execution of the activities.

15. Confidentiality

The Parties undertake to keep the contents of this Contract and its annexes confidential, as well as the information and material acquired during the realization of the activity of the project, as well as ensuring its use in compliance with the provisions of present Contract.

16. Prevention of Fraud and Corruption

SAFIRE is committed to using the funds entrusted to it impartially, justly, and in accordance with the specified purposes. Personal relationships or personal advantages must not influence the decisions of SAFIRE staff or other involved third parties.

In order to prevent corruption effectively and to avoid any suspicion of corrupt behaviour, SAFIRE applies its own anti-fraud and anti-corruption policy, together with the CESVI Guidelines for the Prevention of Corruption and Fraud, which must be respected by the employees of the organisation as well as by other involved third parties, including suppliers.

17. Conflict of interest

Impartiality and objectivity must be ensured at every stage of the procedure, from the planning to the execution of the procurement, including subsequent audits and controls. Conflicts of interest must always be avoided: when dealing with suppliers and consultants, SAFIRE staff must favour the interest of the organisation, refraining from engaging in any behaviour that could result in personal gain.

When confronted with a situation constituting or likely to entail a conflict of interest, every member of the staff shall inform his/her superior, so that appropriate measures can be adopted to avoid such a conflict or its continuation.

18. Safeguarding

SAFIRE has zero tolerance of any form of abuse and sexual exploitation, as well as of bullying and any non-sexual abuse of power, perpetrated by SAFIRE's, its partners' and its suppliers' employees and related personnel against any individual regardless of age, gender, sexuality, disability, religion or ethnic origin.

Tenderers must complete every line of the schedules for each lot they are bidding for, stating the brand or manufacturer offered and the country of origin, and entering unit and total prices in United States Dollars, inclusive of VAT and inclusive of delivery to the specified districts. Quantities are subject to a 20% fluctuation margin per item. Each page of this Annex must be signed and stamped by the tenderer.

LOT 1 – FENCING MATERIALS FOR CONSERVATION AND REGENERATION OF PROTECTED AREAS

Delivery points: Bikita District and Chiredzi District, Masvingo Province.

Installation standards: line post spacing 30 m; droppers at 3 m; poles set at least 600 mm into the ground; stays placed at 30 m intervals; poles H5 treated for ground contact and backed with bitumen paint at 1 litre per 8 poles (600 mm of pole). For 8-strand fencing: droppers 2.5 m apart and not touching the ground, standards 7 m to 10 m apart, holes 300 mm x 600 mm, and an additional 10% of wire allowed for losses during straining and joining.
